

Association Announces Joint Air Traffic and Civil Military Aviation Event ATCA 59th Annual and CMAC Held in Conjunction

March 3, 2014 – Madrid – The Air Traffic Control Association (ATCA) announced it was uniting two of its storied events – the ATCA 59th Annual Conference and Exposition and the Civil Military Aviation Conference (CMAC). CMAC – which occurs bi-annually on a global scale, has most recently been held in Bangkok, and Melbourne, Australia. This year, it will be featured at the ATCA Annual from September 28 to October 1. With an emphasis on collaboration, the ATCA 59th Annual and CMAC will highlight air traffic issues that cover industry, government, civil, and military.

“CMAC comes to North America in 2014 for the first time, and will bring even more of an international focus to the week of networking and business development that always takes place at ATCA,” said Peter F. Dumont, President & CEO of ATCA. “CMAC is always an anticipated and well-attended event. Combining it with the ATCA Annual makes it even more attractive in convenience and cost-savings for participants. The combination will provide an enhanced experience and bring even more value to ATCA’s largest annual event.”

Programming at both the ATCA 59th Annual and CMAC will be concurrent for the first time in the association’s history – offering the option for air traffic management professionals to serve multiple interests and capitalize on business opportunities. In addition, both civil/military and ATC exhibits will be represented in the ATCA Exhibit Hall. Already signed on for the event are organizations including Telegenix, Rockwell Collins, Thales, and Boeing. In addition to the conference and Exhibit Hall, free educational theatres will be featured on the hall floor and host industry leaders exploring the future of aviation, and the technology and cooperation required to get there.
